Hot, sunny or rainy!

We never can tell what the British weather is going to give us, so please make sure your child is prepared for all weathers. Please make sure your child has a water bottle with them each day (with water in, not juice) and a sun hat (these are available as part of our uniform). As the sun becomes stronger, we advise you to put sun cream on your child before they come to school; the long lasting ones can provide protection across the school day. It is tempting not to send your child in with a coat as the weather gets warmer, however if rain or showers are forecast, please ensure they have a raincoat with them also.

Physical Education (PE) Kits – a reminder

Make sure your child has their PE kit in school, which includes appropriate footwear so they can take part in PE outdoors. The items from our school <u>PE kit</u> are listed on the website, please ensure your child has their kit to take part in their PE lessons.

PE is part of the National Curriculum and many children enjoy the range of sports, movements and skills they learn during these lessons.

Phonics Resources - Reception, Year 1 & Year 2

Mrs Monk has been busy making resources to support families of our children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. We know navigating the sounds and information for Phonics can be a bit of a minefield and to help you Mrs Monk has put together some new resources for you on the school website. If you weren't able to attend the parent meeting for Year 1 she did last week – don't worry, she recorded it for you to watch. I know Mrs Monk will be doing some more workshops and resources to help you support your child's phonics learning at home. Please contact the school if you would like further support and information about phonics.

Uniform

Please make sure your child is wearing school uniform. Uniform helps children to feel part of the whole school community and everyone looks smart when they are wearing it. Hoodies and sportswear are not part of our uniform. Most items of uniform do not need to be branded and can be purchased from supermarkets. Father's Day/Special Person Day Stall


