Walk to School Week



At Trinity Road, we will be taking part in the Living Streets five-day walking challenge from Monday 23rd to Friday 27th May. Walk to School Week is an annual celebration of the walk to school and the perfect activity to celebrate National Walking Month this May.

This fun and engaging week-long activity has been designed to make pupils experience first-hand the importance of walking to school. The theme this year is #PowerUp and children will be able to unlock new levels and missions each day. Each mission will help them discover the incredible benefits of walking for individuals, communities and the planet.

Through this challenge, children will be well on their way to reaching their recommended 60 minutes minimum of physical activity per day before even reaching the school gates!

Last year, a record number of over 350,000 pupils across the UK took part! We want to join this growing movement of children

walking to school and help Living Streets make 2022 the biggest year yet!

Even if you live too far away or don't have time to walk the whole way to school, all children can participate in the challenge by walking at least 5-10 minutes to school. We encourage you to 'park and stride' where you can park your car nearby and walk to school from there.

The children will be bringing home an activity diary and bookmark from Living Streets. They will be able to collect stickers in school for each day that they walk to school.
