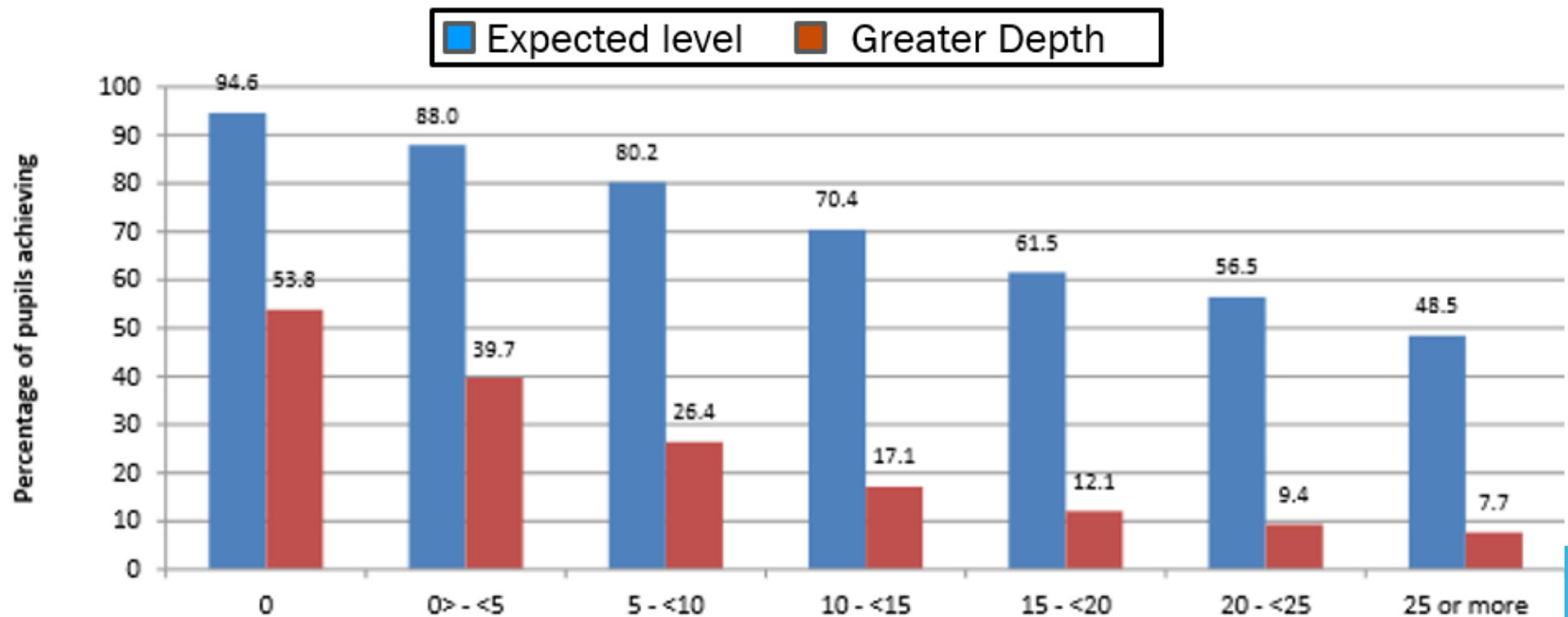

HOME LEARNING

1. Homework has a positive impact on average (+ 5 months),

WHY READ 20 MINUTES AT HOME?

Student A Reads

- ❖ 20 minutes per day.
- ❖ 3,600 minutes per school year.
- ❖ 1,800,000 words per year.



- ❖ Scores in the 90th percentile on standardized tests.

Student B Reads

- ❖ 5 minutes per day.
- ❖ 900 minutes per school year.
- ❖ 282,000 words per year.



- ❖ Scores in the 50th percentile on standardized tests.

Student C Reads

- ❖ 1 minute per day
- ❖ 180 minutes per school year.
- ❖ 8,000 words per year.



- ❖ Scores in the 10th percentile on standardized tests.

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.



Welcome to the Essex Education Portal

Please login using your email address and password. Alternatively, if you are accessing the Portal for the first time, please click Register and follow the guidance provided.


Once logged in to the portal you will be able to submit and view applications for Free Early Education Entitlement for Two Year Olds and School Admissions.

PLEASE NOTE:

The secondary admissions round (for Year 7 in September 2022) will open on the 10th September 2021 and the closing date for applications is the 31st October 2021.

The primary admission round (for Reception in September 2022) will open on the 8th November 2021 and the closing date for applications is the 15th January 2022.

The junior admission round (for infant to junior, year 2 to 3, transfer in September 2022) will open on the 8th November 2021 and the closing date for applications is the 15th January 2022.


- Two ways to apply: printed or online.
 - Schools are holding open events over the next few months (check their website or contact directly)
 - Check the school's admissions criteria (they differ between each school- each school's policy should be on their website)
 - Include grammar schools if your child has completed/is taking the 11+.
- 

- Choose **four** schools, in order of preference. **Use all four options.**
- Ensure all personal information is accurate and inform the local authority if it changes before the offer date as this can affect the process.
- **If you move house you will need to contact admissions.**

SATs (8th-11th May 2023)

Children are tested in:

- Reading
- Grammar and punctuation
- Spelling
- Arithmetic
- Maths (Reasoning 1 and Reasoning 2)



Monday	Grammar, punctuation and spelling
Tuesday	Reading
Wednesday	Arithmetic and Reasoning 1
Thursday	Reasoning 2

- Children are expected to reach the national curriculum expectations for year 6.
 - The tests determine if your child:
 - Has met the expected standard
 - Is working towards the expected standard
 - Achieved above the expected standard
- OR
- Is working towards the expected standard.
 - There is no additional test for the higher levels. This will be incorporated into the main tests, so we still expect many children to exceed the average expectations. Questions are mixed difficulty throughout the papers.
 - Writing is assessed by teachers rather than a test.

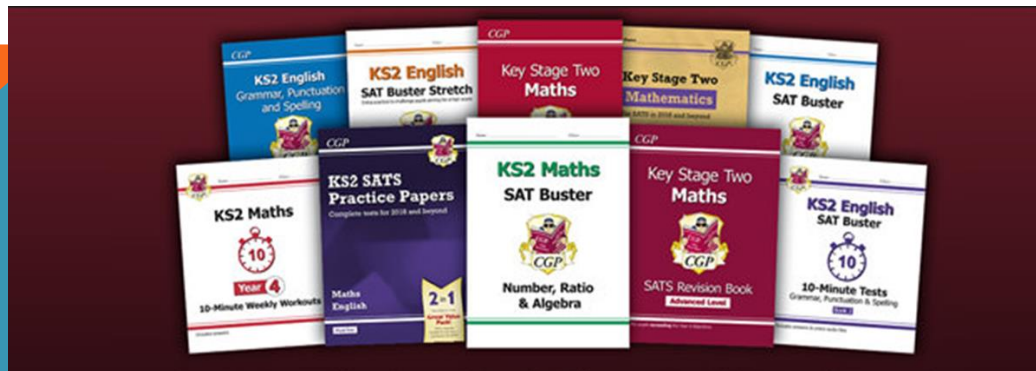
