Head Teacher's Message

Dear families.

It is very nearly the end of term! Christmas is not long away and there have been many exciting things going on in and around the school.

I was so pleased so many families could join us at the church on Wednesday for the Christmas Carol Concert, the children performed beautifully and we hope you enjoyed it too. The staff and children have been working so hard to bring this to you, I know you will join me in thanking them all.

Scarlet Fever & Strep A

With the rise in cases of Scarlet Fever & Strep A, I am sending the information out to you again, to help you know what to look out for.

Health guidance - Signs and symptoms of scarlet fever

Scarlet fever is a common childhood infection caused by Streptococcus pyogenes, or group A Streptococcus (GAS). It is not usually serious, but should be treated with antibiotics to reduce the risk of complications (such as pneumonia) and spread to others. The early symptoms of scarlet fever include sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours, the characteristic red, pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach, then rapidly spreading to other parts of the body, and giving the skin a sandpaper-like texture.

The scarlet rash may be harder to spot on darker skin, although the 'sandpaper' feel should be present. Patients typically have flushed cheeks and be pale around the mouth. This may be accompanied by a bright red red 'strawberry' tongue.

If you think you, or your child, might have scarlet fever:

 contact your GP or NHS 111 as soon as possible

 Signs & symptoms

 The symptoms of scarlet fever are non-specific in early illness and may include;
 sore throat,
 headache,
 high temprature,
 neusea and vomiting.

 After 12 to 48 hours the characteristic red, generalised pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach, rapidly spreading to other parts of the body, giving the skin a sandpaper-like texture.

- make sure that you or your child take(s) the full course of any antibiotics prescribed. Although you or your child will feel better soon after starting the course of antibiotics, you must complete the course to ensure that you do not carry the bacteria in your throat after you have recovered
- stay at home, away from nursery, school or work for at least 24 hours after starting the antibiotic treatment, to avoid spreading the infection

You can help stop the spread of infection through frequent hand washing and by not sharing eating utensils, clothes, bedding and towels. All contaminated tissues should be disposed of immediately.

We are reporting confirmed cases to the Health Protection Agency and the Local Authority, following advice and guidance to mitigate the potential spread (including hand washing and sanitising) as well as increasing ventilation and ensuring coughs and sneezes are caught in a tissue and children wash their hands afterwards.

Thank you to everyone who is working with the school to ensure everyone is safe. We realise this is a worrying time.


