<u>Strike Action – Teachers</u>

The first upcoming NEU strike action date is this Wednesday 1st February.

While there is no definite guarantee that we will not have to close, currently the school will be open and staffed on Wednesday 1st February. This may not be the case for future dates and I will write to you nearer the time to let you know our arrangements.

The dates that affect our region are not all of the dates published, but include:

- Wednesday 1st February
- Wednesday 1st March
- Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th March

I am continually working with the staff to take all reasonable and appropriate steps to keep the school open, for the above dates, for our

most vulnerable children, SEND, disadvantaged, key worker children and children sitting upcoming external examinations.

Going forward, other unions are also seeking to strike and therefore we should be aware there may be additional dates in the future.

<u>Spelling Shed – Home support for spellings Year 2-6</u>

As part of our spelling programme, children have been excitedly using their Spelling Shed logins during the school day. These can also be used at home to support the learning of spellings. Children in Years 2 - 6 will be given their logins to access the website: https://play.edshed.com/engb/spelling. The website can be accessed through the username and password or via the QR code on the log-ins.



Spelling Shed is a game like format to support children with learning their spellings. Children can choose their own level of difficulty for the games and build their Spelling Shed score up. The game like format will encourage children to rehearse their spellings, which will in turn improve their writing and vocabulary.

Winter Illnesses

As you may have seen in recent news reports, the NHS is under severe pressure this winter due to the rise in cases of flu, Covid 19 and scarlet fever.

The current advice issued by the Chief Medical Adviser at the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) is that:

- Children remain at home if they have fever and only return to school when the fever has gone, and they feel well.
- Children are helped to learn about the importance of hand washing with soap and hot water. They are taught to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues and and bin them immediately.

If your child is unwell with a fever, then please do keep them at home until their fever has gone and they feel well enough to return to school.

If your child tests positive for Covid 19 please do keep them at home for three full days **after the day,** they have tested positive and ensure that they only return to school when they are well enough to do so.

In school we will be ensuring that classrooms are well ventilated; reminding children and staff about the importance of regular hand washing and will continue to ensure hand sanitiser is available in classrooms and communal spaces.


