#### **Head Teacher's Message**

#### Dear families,

#### **Be On Time! - School Times**



Gates open at 8.35am and the blue doors open at 8.45am.

The school bell will sound at 8.50am to let everyone know the gates will be closing in 5 minutes.

At 8.55am the gates will close and all children need to be in by this time.

#### **Drop Kerb Parking**

I am asking again for families to park safely and respectfully.

Some vehicles are parking on the pavement and are obstructing drop kerbs. As a result of this, our families with pushchairs and our families who need mobility access are unable to cross the road at all, because there is no safe place to cross.

#### WW2 Learning In Years 5 & 6

Years 5 and 6 had a very engaging start to their new Topic, World War 2 (WW2), with an artefacts handling session at Chelmsford Museum. They learnt about how the war affected one family in Chelmsford, in particular, before enjoying two handling sessions. In one session, they explored rationing of food and clothing by visiting the local shops in the experience to purchase their rationed goods. In the other, they learnt about air raids by handling a number of artefacts related to air raids (gas masks, rattles, bells and a water pump) as well as experiencing some time in an air raid shelter to understand how people in WW2 felt and how they sang songs and made the best of the time they had in there.

They have returned to school full of excitement for their Topic and armed with further questions they want to know about World War 2. A huge thank you to the parents that gave up their time to make the visits possible, we really appreciate the ongoing support of parents with our visits.

#### All classes will be open and staffed

I continue to work with the staff to try to take all reasonable and appropriate steps to keep the school open, for the above dates, for our most vulnerable children, SEND, disadvantaged, key worker children and children sitting upcoming external examinations, while also respecting the right of staff to strike. We were one of the only settings that remained open throughout all the previous strike dates, but there is no definite guarantee that we will not have to close. I will keep you updated as far in advance as I can work, to enable you to make appropriate plans. Staff are under no obligation to inform me if they intend to strike and we

may only be aware of staff striking if they do not arrive for work on the strike days.

Going forward there may be new dates added to these and other unions may also seeking to strike and therefore we should be aware there may be additional dates in the future.

#### Park & Stride - The Meadows Parking - How to Apply

Do you want a reliable place to park where you won't get a ticket for drop off and pick up times?



From now on, if you wish to utilize the park & stride scheme at The Meadows you will still need to enquire at our school reception, where we will be able to verify that you are indeed parents of a attend-

ing child. The school office team will now only need to take down the required vehicle registration and the postcode of your home address (which should the same address as we hold for your child in our school system and the address that your car is insured at), both of which will need to be passed onto Essex County Council to be added onto a database. There is no physical permit to display – it is all done on your vehicle registration number.

Once you are registered here is the advice from the council:

When parking after being registered, a parent would still need to take a ticket when entering the carpark, (but do not pay at the machines). On exit they need to push the help button to exit. The controller will ask them for their vehicle registration number and to scan their ticket. The first 45 minutes will be free, beyond the 45 minutes will be payable whilst at the exit barrier.

#### **Smart Watches**

Smart watches are mobile devices with many extras on them, including the ability to take photos. We do not allow smart watches, of any sort, in school and we will be asking children to remove these devices if they are wearing them to school.
